It's a Process

Like your favorite recipe you follow a specific process. When you follow that process you get the results you expect.

Example:

Step 1: Think of a number between 1 and 20....

Step 2: Double it

Step 3: Add 10

Step 4: Divide by 2

Step 5: Now, subtract the same number you startedwith

Result: 5!

I can repeat this process over and over and get the desired outcome "I" want.

Our process begins with the family consultation

From there we discuss common language, terms and lingo. For example, we begin by explaining the **Defense** and **Offense** of college admissions as well as **Safety, Match** and **Reach** schools, **FAFSA**, **CSS**, **PSAT**, **NMSQT** and more.

Defense

1. Don't give them a reason to reject you.

We do this by ensuring they have a strong academic background; GPA, Class Rank, AP scores, SAT/ACT and PSAT scores.

Stanford University – Accepted 2,114 students. However, 25,518 students applied with a GPA of 4.0 and above. That's not all of the students that applied (they had 45,000+ applicants).

UC Berkeley - Admitted 14,624 students. 28,518 students were rejected with a 4.0+ GPA.

UC Davis – Even UCD rejected 10,739 applicants were just within 10% of the average 4.1 GPA!

2. Best fit

From there we discuss where your student fits based on their academic background and which schools are Safety, Match or Reach school for them.

Safety: These are colleges where **admission is probable**. Your academic profile and qualifications closely align with the college's average requirements, making it a good fit.

Match: These are colleges where *admission is more likely*. Your academic profile and qualifications exceed the requirements, making them a safer option for admission.

Reach: These are colleges where admission is more competitive. You may have *lower chances of acceptance*, but they can be a great fit if you're willing to put in extra effort.

3. Shore up gaps on defense.

With a target of peaking at the end of their junior year or first quarter of her senior year

Offense

1. Extracurricular Actvities



Community Service

Engage in meaningful community service activities to demonstrate your commitment to social responsibility.



Athletics

Showcase your sports involvement and leadership skills on and off the field.



Performing Arts

Participate in music, theater, or dance to highlight your creative abilities and teamwork skills.

2. Evaluate and highlight roles and involvement

Sports: Captain

Clubs: Vice President

Competitions: placed 2nd

Summer programs: Selected to participate at MIT

And more.

3. Essays and Personal Statement

An average essay and personal statement can keep them out of elite institutions.

When to start and where should you spend your time?

1. 9th - 12th Grade

By starting early, less time is spent figuring out what a child is interested in, and the more time they can dedicate to building a longer track record of doing things in that field than other students.

2. Avoid wasting time getting into internships or programs that don't matter.

Get accepted into selective internships/programs that increase their chances at a good college.

3. Access the most effective mix/balance of academics.

Honors/AP classes, SAT/ACT, subject tests), projects, internships, volunteering to maximize their chances to get into the college they deserve.
